THE BULLY PROBLEM was developed by Michael Gordon Shapiro in association with New Musicals Inc. The show had its first workshop production at the 2017 STAGES Festival and was one of only two shows to be accepted in the 2018 ASCAP Musical Theatre Workshop in Los Angeles, run by Academy Award winning composer/lyricist Stephen Schwartz.

In June 2019 the show made its world premiere at the Hollywood Fringe festival, where it sold out every performance at the 96-seat Broadwater Main Stage. In addition to receiving seven award nominations, The Bully Problem won the Encore Producer's Award, which resulted in extension performances at Hollywood's historic Arena Stage. www.thebullyproblem.com

NMI offers a biennial conference on the busness of the musical theatre industry, where musical theatre creators can learn from producers and production companies. During 2020 and 2021, a virtual pitch conference was conducted.



NMI offers a 9-month core curriculum program where bookwriters, lyricists and composers are teamed up each month. All teams read the same assigned play then write a specific song (ballad, charm song, comedy number, for example) which is presented for feedback the following month.



The Core Curriculum culminates in 15-minute musicals based on a selected theme.

A 9-month Full-Length Curriculum is offered where existing teams prepare a new, full-length musical which is often submitted for a staged reading (with music) at the Hollywood Fringe Festival.
